### GREETINGS FROM REV. JOE

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We continue to feed our six Arlington Neighborhood families during the summer months and are happy to accept donations of food items or cash to purchase any of the items we give on a weekly basis (cereal, pasta and sauce, canned fruit and veggies, soup, tuna, peanut butter and jelly).

## AFFORDABLE HOUSING UPDATE

Earlier this spring, the *Lawrence Eagle Tribune* had an article about possible affordable housing on the St. Andrew's property. Your Vestry and its Affordable Housing Study Committee thought it would be helpful to include an update on the status of the affordable housing study.

The most important point to make is that the study committee is still in the early stages of investigating whether affordable housing might be feasible and appropriate as a ministry for our parish. No decision has been made for an affordable housing project. Any such decision would have to be made by Vestry after discussion and prayer by the parish community. That will not happen until the members of the parish have ample opportunity for information, discussion, and prayer.

The Vestry formed an Affordable Housing Study Committee to look into affordable housing and report back to vestry about it. The vestry will then discuss that report with the parish. The members of the Study Committee are Laura Walta (chair), Janet Ratcliffe, Len Brown, Matt McKeon, and Rev. Joe. St Andrew's received two small grants from Episcopal City Mission to pay for expert consultants to help the Study Committee look at a variety of issues involved in affordable housing. The issues include the local need for affordable housing, zoning, environmental impact, site requirements, architectural possibilities, financing, and, very importantly, impact on the parish. Both the Vestry and Study Committee believe that affordable housing makes sense for St. Andrew's only if it is a viable ministry and has a positive impact on parish life and finances.

Thus far, the Study Committee has been working with consultants and with staff at Episcopal City Mission to look at architectural possibilities and to sound out local officials and possible large granting agencies. The Study Committee is now looking for a consultant to help look at affordable housing's viability as a business proposition. As information is developed, it will be reported to Vestry. When Vestry and the Study Committee have a complete assessment of affordable housing's feasibility, there will be parish meeting to review the study's report, discuss and pray. Discussion and prayer might take some time before the Vestry can get a sense of the best way to go.

Meanwhile, members of the committee are happy to talk with parishioners about this. Rev. Joe and Laura will field inquiries that might come from outside the parish.

## FROM THE TREASURER

*The Good News.* Thank you to everyone who has made the effort to keep his or her pledge current. Our pledge income is running very close to what was projected in the budget presented by the Vestry at our annual meeting. We are now into the summer season when attendance drops and pledges lag, so we'll appreciate your continuing efforts to stay current.

*The Bad News.* The expenses of running our church (salaries, heat, light, insurance, office, janitorial, maintenance and worship) continue to significantly outweigh our income (offering and rental). Through May 31<sup>st</sup>, our average weekly income and expenses (these numbers are only averages and do not reflect adjustments for seasonal considerations such as the cost of heating fuel) were as follows:




